The Old Joliet Prison opened in 1858 and was built in an iconic castellated gothic architecture by W.W. Boyington using locally quarried Joliet limestone. By 1878, the Prison was over capacity with nearly 2,000 inmates. Reports of unsanitary and dangerous conditions emerged and by 1905, calls for the closure of the "old prison" were made, but it continued to house offenders until 2002, when it was finally closed by Governor George Ryan. The Old Joliet Prison is open seasonally for group tours conducted by trained staff.

While in the historic district, groups can also see Hotel Florence, Greenstone Church and visit the A.
